Andrew Furco is Associate Vice President for Public Engagement at the University of Minnesota, where he also serves as an Associate Professor in the College of Education and Human Development and as Director of the University's International Center for Research on Community Engagement. His research focuses on experiential learning, civic engagement, and service-learning . Furco



served for 14 years as director of the Service-Learning Research and Development Center at the University of California-Berkeley. His publications include the co-edited books, *Service-Learning: The Essence of the Pedagogy* (2001) and *Service-Learning Through a Multidisciplinary Lens* (2002), as well as more than 40 journal articles and book chapters exploring the practice and study of community engagement. Furco is the recipient of the 2003 Award for Outstanding Contributions to Service-Learning Research as well as the National Society for Experiential Education's 2006 *Researcher of the Year Award*. He is also the inaugural award recipient for the national John Glenn Service-Learning Scholar Award. Furco received his bachelor and masters degrees from UCLA and his doctoral degree in educational administration from UC Berkeley.

Elson Nash is Acting Director of Learn and Serve America, a program of the Corporation for National and Community Service, where he has worked for over seven years. He is a graduate of UC Berkeley (BA) and Emory University (MPH) with over 17 years of experience in higher education, non-profit management and government relations. In the past Nash has served as Executive Director of California Campus Compact, Deputy Director at Ashoka (an International Foundation for Social Entrepreneurs), Program Manager for Urban Affairs at AASCU & NASULGC, and Cluster Coordinator at The Carter Center of Emory University. In each of these positions he has focused on some aspect of civic engagement or service-learning.
